President's Dinner 2010

OPRFC 2009-10

The Old Priorian Rugby Club started its second season in September 2009, keen to build upon last year's great start and the narrow 16-11 loss in the Middlesex Bowl Final to Teddington. Our first season in league rugby saw us enter Herts/Middlesex 2, a programme that would leave little time for the exciting friendlies we had played last year - however our matches against higher placed opposition would come in time. A good pre-season with tough fixtures against Staines (London 1), Imperial Medicals (London 2) and Old Hamptonians (London 3) meant we were ready for the league campaign, kicking off with convincing victories, Quintin (73-10) and Old Isleworthians (43-14). Unfortunately the latter fixture was to cause two long term injuries with neither Danny Farren nor Ricky Martin to feature again this season, both of whom had played a crucial role in 2008-09. The first tough test came in a friendly against Battersea Ironsides, a strong team with a good forward pack and a destructive flanker. Fortunately Tom Wade's individual try was the difference in a 13-12 victory. For the next few weeks we carried on in a similar manner, not performing to the best of our ability but getting the results. A superb defensive display led to a 19-10 win at Hackney in a game where we hardly saw the ball. A small pitch and poor conditions meant for a scrappy match which was saved for us by a try from prolific winger Seb Oddi.

It was becoming apparent that the league was a two horse race between ourselves and H.A.C. On the 28th November we travelled to their grounds in Moorgate (apparently the second most expensive rugby real estate in the world!) needing to step up our performance and deliver another victory. The game was tense but our forwards started to dominate both at the line-out and the scrum. The pressure told and Aristide Goualin kicked five penalties to give us a good lead. The exceptional Dave Haston confirmed the 20-5 victory with a try near the end. A fantastic performance and a huge result. All eyes were now on the return fixture in March. We pushed on with a scrappy win over Belsize Park 21-6 and further, more convincing league wins in the weeks after Christmas (whenever the fields weren't covered in snow!). Hackney again caused us problems in the return fixture in February but we survived their insistence on kicking with tries from Edd Conway (2), Matt Dever

(2) and Sean O'Connell. Both still at school Matt and Sean showed their quality this season for the OPs. The return H.A.C. fixture was soon upon us on the 6th March. After a morning and afternoon of Junior School 7s there was a good crowd for a fixture that will undoubtedly be repeated in much higher leagues than this. H.A.C. had a few new faces and both sides put 100% into a tight game that never opened up. The opposition worked a nice try to score on the stroke of half-time and that proved to be enough as we lost 8-6. This was the first home defeat since the club's inception and was a painful loss, one that would cost us the league title on points difference. We pushed on and won our remaining games, Seb Oddi scoring 7 in our last three league games alone and taking his season total to an incredible 27. Fortunately, despite coming second we were still promoted and are looking forward to gaining some revenge against H.A.C. in Herts/Middlesex 1 next season.

OPRFC Middlesex Bowl Champions 2009-10

We kicked off our Middlesex Bowl campaign with a 30-24 victory over Saracens Amateurs in February. Having lost in the Final last year we were eager to go one step further but the trophy at times took second place in our minds due to our focus on the tussle with H.A.C. in the league. On the day an OP U23 side took to the pitch and played some outstanding running rugby, orchestrated by the mercurial Jack Dever at 10. Saul Gerald, Jono Moore, Joe Wellings, David Wilkie and Matt Dever

made their OP debuts only a couple of weeks after their school First XV Daily Mail campaign had ended at the hands of eventual champions Whitgift. The latter three all scored debut tries to help wrap up the win whilst all were impressive. Little did we know how important the Upper 6 cohort would become in the following Bowl matches. With the league campaign over we headed to Chiswick (London 2) on 17th April with a tough task ahead. Not only were Chiswick a good side, more than comfortable in London 2, but the season had taken its toll and we entered the game without key players in Stokes,

Maynard, Davis, Haxby and Blom. It was time for a young squad to step up. Soon enough into the game we knew that we had the quality to win, but grinding out the result was to be a tough proposition. Down 8-3 at half-time we clawed our way back into the game with school players Ross McIntosh and David Wilkie combining well to put the latter over in the corner. A fantastic counter attack then saw the Dever brothers, Matt and Jack, run the ball from deep. Combining with Edd Conway and Will Clarke, Jack Dever was soon racing 30m to score under the posts. Chiswick regained a 16-15 lead with minutes to go but the OPs kept pushing and the pressure told following excellent work by Farren, McCulloch and Sam Wellings and we were awarded a penalty with 45 seconds remaining. Edd Conway kicked the points and the OPs were into the final.

Another game against London 2 opposition saw the OPs travel to the Linford Christie Stadium to face a big, abrasive London Nigerian side smarting from their relegation to London 3. Our first half was superb. Despite going briefly behind, Andrew Wilkie scored from a line-out drive, Huw Jones scored following an exceptional kick and chase by David Wilkie and then Matt Dever read the opposition fly-half superbly to intercept and race 60m to give us a 22-11 lead. We knew that London Nigerian would come back at us strongly and they came out firing, keeping the ball tight and gaining ground with strong runners. We also failed to keep playing and turned the ball over scrappily on numerous occasions. They kept the scoreboard ticking over and the finale was tense. We headed into the final few minutes with a 25-21 lead, battling to stay in front. The momentum swung one last time thanks to an impeccable hit by Ross McIntosh which allowed us to turn over the ball. Soon enough the final whistle went and we had hung on for a big victory. Alex Wightman was named Man of the Match following an incredible grafting performance at 7, making countless tackles and playing a huge role in the win. Now for London 1 which started in September and the RFU Junior Vase Trophy which has its Final at Twickenham - the wheels are already in motion to try and give us the best chance possible of being there!

Joe Simpson returns to St Benedict's School

Rugby player Joe Simpson (OP 2006), Wasps and England Saxons scrum half, returned to his old school St Benedict's, Ealing on Wednesday 21st April 2010. It was a special occasion as Joe was presenting to the School £1,000 worth of sports kit, generously donated by Amlin, the specialist insurers who sponsor the European Challenge Cup.

Joe had been nominated as Amlin Man of the Match during Wasps 13-3 away victory against Bayonne in the pool stage fixture on 17th December 2009 and had chosen St Benedict's School to be the beneficiary of the kit and equipment donation.

At the morning assembly he spoke of his passion for rugby and of his hopes for this season. Wasps are very much in line for a top four finish and a place in the title play-offs. Later, in the Sports Hall, he offered coaching tips to Year 11 and Year 6 pupils, as they used the donated equipment for the first time.

Joe remembers his time at St Benedict's fondly. Asked about his best rugby memory from his schooldays, he recalled


the game against Whitgift School, Croydon when his brother Michael gave him the pass which allowed him to make the winning score.

School Lunch!

In each of the past two years we have held a very successful "five year reunion" lunch at Perivale at which many Old Priorians and their partners expressed pleasure in meeting up again and seeing the developments that have taken place at the playing fields. This year we decided on developing this idea and so organised our first School View and Lunch. Now we felt that many, from all vintages, might appreciate the opportunity to come back to "Ealing" and see "what has changed" at the School since they left; there was to be an additional "first" as well - Council decided that the event was to be

advertised by email and word of mouth only and not circulated to all our members by post. So it was that on Sunday 9th May 2010 St Benedict's School welcomed back just over twenty Old Priorians - together with their partners and other guests we formed a group of forty.

The 10.30am Mass in the Abbey Church, whilst not forming a formal part of the occasion, was attended by many. All then congregated in the Cloisters of the School, a fine setting for welcome drinks. In a few words of welcome, Chris Cleugh, the Headmaster reminded us that OPs and their families never really leave St Benedict's, but always remain as part of the Community and Benedictine family at Ealing. He also mentioned that after lunch we would see much of the "bricks and mortar" development that had taken place in the years since we had left. The School had just launched a Bursary Appeal, designed not for "buildings", but for building future generations of OPs by giving the opportunity of the education provided at Ealing to boys and girls who perhaps would not in the normal course of events, be able to afford it. There followed a splendid two course lunch (including "seconds" - just like the old

days of school lunches!) with wine, served in the Cloisters Hall.

The day concluded with a grand tour of the School, most ably guided by Marek Nalewajko who for many years had taught Maths at St Benedict's, but who since September 2008 has been the Marketing Director of the School. This gave all an occasion to see and admire the new buildings and facilities that had not existed in their time here and also to reminisce about the "good old days"; with Old Priorians ranging in vintage from 1950 to 1991 there were many memories to share and compare.

This was a most memorable day and it is hoped that the event will become a regular feature on the Old Priorian and School calendars. Many thanks are due to Catherine de Cintra, Bursar and Richard Baker (1959), Assistant Administrator OPA for organising this successful event. To those OPs who have left St Benedict's in more recent years, perhaps there would not be so much "new" to see at such an event, but we are sure there would be something! perhaps for the next time you might try to arrange a group and come along to meet some of the older generations of OPs who have passed through the "corridors at St Benedict's School" in the space of the last one hundred and eight years!
